CAO Report

Chief Administrative Officer Ross Rawlusk reviewed his CAO Report with Council. Highlights of his report included the following:

- He has been working on finalizing the 2015 municipal budget and it is now ready for presentation at today's meeting. There are lots of competing programs and projects to try and work into the budget, as well as some large "provincial" funding holes to fill in. Approximately \$2.2 million is budgeted for capital assets, including new fire trucks in Rumsey and Morrin and funds set aside to pursue land and develop plans to start construction of the first of several new fire halls. Taxation rates remain relatively level, with a slight decrease in tax rates for residential as the assessment values increased once again and a small increase in farmland rates of 1.55% in total.
- On May 24th, Premier Notley and the new Cabinet were sworn in at a large public gathering at the legislature. There are now only 12 Cabinet members appointed.
- Ross attended the 13th Annual Municipal Administration Leadership Workshop in Kananaskis from May 12th to 15th, 2015. He attended several sessions which proved very interesting.
- Stantec is continuing work on the Rural Road Study for the County. The bridge recommendations were excellent and they certainly have compiled a great deal of data on our road network. However, there is still some work to be done on the roads

identified for future construction. The study should be ready for presentation to Council in a month or so.

- The Annual Toxic Waste Roundup (including E-Waste) will be held on Friday, June 5th at the Starland County Public Works yard from 8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.
- The Craigmyle Centennial is coming up really fast. There are lots of things to do on the County list including building removal, cemetery cleanup, street improvements, hamlet clean-up, bylaw enforcement, park upgrading and parade preparations. An internal committee of staff will be making sure we have the resources and people dedicated to making this event successful.
- Ross suggested that we host a joint municipal meeting with our three Village jurisdictions. Several items of interest to include on the agenda might be the grant programs, rural crime watch, fire hall construction guidelines as well as other items suggested by the Village Councils.
- The Starland Water Authority also needs to meet to update the Authority water rates and review financial information.
- Sharon completed a survey looking at land acquisition rates, earth-borrow and crop damage payments of neighbouring municipalities. Starland's current policies appear to be in-line or better than our neighbours.
- Matthew and Ross met with Jeff Bellingher from Nichols Applied Management, who is conducting our organizational review. He has made several suggestions that will assist with the future design of Starland County's management structure and a Council presentation will be booked in the near future.
- Ross has now completed his medical leave and notes that he is happy to be back. Thanks to those that helped fill in while he was away.

At 10:15 a.m., Cpl. Kevin Charles, Acting Detachment Commander of the Drumheller RCMP attended the meeting to discuss various issues with Council. He reviewed their performance plan, detachment priorities and the statistical comparison report from 2011 to 2014. He also outlined their departments priorities noting that drug crimes are their first priority, with impaired driving as a second priority, coupled with other traffic infractions including distracted driving, seat belts, etc., and property crimes and trends as their third priority. At 11:00 a.m., Public Works Supervisor Pratt attended the meeting and reviewed his Public Works Report with Council. Highlights of his report included the following:

- Crews have been busy building and widening approaches, landscaping at the Munson Transfer site for the fence, pumping water in problem areas, picking rocks, organizing and stacking new culverts, patching pot holes in the hamlets and dust control spots, flagging, packing, etc. with the pulverising program;
- Two PW Crew completed the online flag person training;
- Mechanics, Sharon and some of the PW Crew had a hands on course with the fuel truck trainer from Ontario, with the new fuel truck;
- The gravel program has now commenced as of Monday, May 25th. Colleena, Al, Brenda, Kevin and Sharon had a start-up meeting with the gravel truckers at the Moench Pit. Al noted that Richard Christensen has submitted his resignation as a contract gravel trucker.
- The Dust Control Program will be advertised starting this week in the Drumheller Mail;
- Craigmyle Hamlet Clean-up will be done on June 4th and 5th;
- Al noted that Cayle Griffith has requested to rent the dozer to do some work at his farm this weekend. As per Policy No. 120-1, employees may utilize County owned equipment for their own use

and benefit; and the equipment must only be operated by an employee of the County.

Municipal Services
Report

At 11:55 a.m., Manager Riep attended the meeting and reviewed his Municipal Services Report with Council. Highlights of his report included the following:

- He has been working on a few outstanding items from the CLV water project. The chain link fence has been completed on the water truckfill site with some additional barb wire fencing to be completed. They have also been working on some minor landscaping and clean-up issues that needed done. Rick Dunsmore is completing the final work on the mobile solar/generator trailer unit.
- Alberta Development and Sustainable Resources held its annual update and information open house at the Dickson Dam site earlier this month.
- Glen met with a group representing the Craigmyle Centennial event to go over in detail the work involved with the park. They requested some park lighting to be included and would like the addition of three street or walkway lights within the park. Glen outlined the options available and the costs for same. He noted that the major limitation with this work will be the underground work and further disruption with the final landscaping operations.
- The tree replacement/installation is to be done as soon as possible. He is hoping to utilize the existing trees from the nursery at McLaren Dam.
- A joint fire training course is scheduled over the next couple of weekends in Drumheller. This training will be considered part of the training opportunities under the provincial fire and emergency training grant received.
- A Provincial Fire Ban has been issued for all parts of the province within the forest restricted areas of the province.

Correspondence was received from the AAMDC with regards to their formal feedback on the proposed changes to Alberta's drinking water regulations. They noted that it was extremely challenging to aggregate the views of their members into a single document. In addition, and very importantly, they are concerned about the lack of a public consultation process for these proposed changes. It is important that municipalities are properly informed of these changes and provided an opportunity to provide their input.

The Safety Codes Council also noted that they periodically review the files of accredited organizations to ensure that terms and conditions of the accreditation designation are being met. They noted that the approved Fire Quality Management Plan presently in use for Starland County, Delia, Morrin and Munson was approved in January 1996 and that the standards have changed considerably since then. They have directed that we review and update our Fire QMP as soon as possible.

2015 Annual Operating & Capital Budgets

CAO Rawlusk and Assistant CAO Bremer reviewed the highlights of the proposed 2015 Annual Municipal Operating and Capital Budgets for Starland County with Council. The major projects for the year 2015 were highlighted and noted that the total operating budget expenditures are estimated at \$16,295,260.00 and the total capital budget is \$2,948,324.00, with an overall budgeted surplus of \$9,511.00. CAO Rawlusk noted that the total assessment within the County increased approximately 2.67%. The largest increase is assessment was from Class 1 - Residential Properties, which increased 9.22%. Non-Residential properties also increased approximately 3.00%. As always, he advised that we work towards a stabilized total tax rate in the County. In 2015, the draft budget presented will see a substantial decrease in Class 1 Residential tax rates, to help offset the residential assessment increase. Following Council's previous direction, Farmland taxation was increased by 2.0%. Overall, with a major reduction to the Non-Collection allowance, the increase is moderated to just 1.55%. The Drumheller and District Senior's Foundation tax rate increased 7.32%. The major items in the Capital Budget Estimates besides replacement of various vehicles and equipment, include funding for some preliminary design work

for new fire halls as well as money for the Rumsey and Morrin Fire Trucks.
