## Public Works Report

Public Works Supervisor Pratt presented his Public Works Report to Council. Highlights of his report included the following:

- Crews re-did the firewood area and placed concrete blocks as a barrier in the wood pile.
- Started on Rumsey playground clean-up and removal of the hazardous equipment.

- Orientation on the new hydro-vac.
- Shop mechanics are busy with regular maintenance and minor repair items.
- The gravel program now has 182 miles completed as well as 70 miles of add-ons.
- Brenda has been monitoring a major ongoing fracking project in the area.

CAO Report

Chief Administrative Officer Ross Rawlusyk reviewed his CAO Report with Council. Highlights of his report included the following:

- Ross attended the Solar West Conference in Calgary on October 8<sup>th</sup> and 9<sup>th</sup>. He noted that Jordan participated on a panel discussion on the opportunities and constraints for community solar and he felt that he did a great job of representing the County.
- He spent a considerable amount of time researching the Village of Rumsey's History for the update of the Rumsey history book.
- The Christmas Party is tentatively scheduled for December 11<sup>th</sup>, 2015.
- The "Man Van" is coming to Morrin on Election Day, October 19<sup>th</sup>, 2015, from 10 a.m. to 1 p.m. It is Canada's first and only mobile Prostrate Specific Antigen (PSA) testing program. Ross has offered to accommodate the van in our parking lot at the back and also to cook lunch that day for the staff in the man van.
- The vast majority of revenue from taxation rolled in at the end of September, keeping staff very busy with payments.
- Various local investment opportunities were reviewed, however, the best rates we were able to garner that works with our payment schedule came from ATB Financial.
- The Federal Election is coming up on Monday, October 19<sup>th</sup>.
- The CAAMDC Fall Zone Meeting will be held on Friday, October 16<sup>th</sup> in Red Deer County, commencing at 10 a.m.
- Our internal Safety Audit commenced on October 13<sup>th</sup> and Sharon will be interviewing several staff members this week.
- The Mayor's and Reeve's Liaison Committee Meeting is scheduled for Monday, November 16<sup>th</sup>, 2015 at 5:00 p.m. in the Shaw Conference Centre.
- Ross noted that he reviewed the November schedule for Council meetings, and the November 11<sup>th</sup> meeting falls on a holiday day and suggested we could change our meeting to Thursday, November 12<sup>th</sup>. Then the AAMDC Fall Convention is in Edmonton the following week, so he suggested that we cancel the November 25<sup>th</sup> meeting.

Report

At 11:30 a.m., Manager Riep attended the meeting and reviewed his Municipal Services Report with Council. Highlights of his report included the following:

- They completed the expansion to their irrigation system at the river to improve their ability to water the area with less labour needed to move pipes around.
- Crews have been dealing with a number of issues with the water supply coming off the Starland system from Midland over the last week or so. Glen has been trouble shooting problems with the pressure controls and pressure sustaining valves which operate the pumps and water flows within the system. MPE is scheduled to come out this week and re-program parts of the system, however, it appears as though we may need to do a complete evaluation of the Munson station to determine the extent of the problems.
- On the weekend a powerline was blown down in the wind storm creating power outages. Also the main breaker control at the Midland station is badly corroded and is inoperable requiring replacement.
- Glen and Theo are still working on getting a tender package together on some of the smaller water projects. They are experiencing problems securing the proper piping materials to replace the section of steel line coming out of Drumheller serving the CLV system, so Theo may proceed with the other smaller projects in the interim.
- The Rumsey fire truck is proceeding along as the tank and pump have all been installed. The delivery date is for early December.
- The Morrin fire truck chassis arrived in Winnipeg and delivery isn't expected until spring of 2016.
- Glen attended the Solar West Conference in Calgary.

AAMDC re: Bridge Opt-Outs under Navigation Protection Act

Correspondence was received from the AAMDC with regards to a Member Bulletin on *Understanding Bridge Opt-Outs Under the Navigation Protection Act*. Alberta Transportation, as the technical owner of all municipally-managed local road bridges in the province, have requested the AAMDC's assistance in gathering information as to whether or not rural municipalities support having the bridges that they manage opted out of the NPA. The new NPA will reduce the administrative burden on municipalities constructing bridges, as navigation assessments, which under the former NWPA were required on bridges constructed over any body of water that could conceivably support navigation, will now only be required on bridges constructed over specific waterways identified in the new NPA as being critical to navigation. Municipalities will have the opportunity to vote on a resolution in this regard at the upcoming AAMDC Fall Convention.

Alternative Transportation for Seniors

A new toolkit has been developed for the *Implementation of Alternative Transportation for Seniors in Alberta*. The toolkit will provide guidance to community groups and/or municipalities interested in developing a transportation system to assist seniors and others with limited mobility options in navigating the communities. Several workshops will be held throughout the province in this regard.
