CAO Report

Chief Administrative Officer Ross Rawluyk reviewed his CAO Report with Council. Highlights of his report included the following:

- Presently the economic outlook in Alberta is in a downturn. Oil prices are at a 12 year low. Job losses are the worst since 1982 when the province lost more than 45,000 jobs. The strains of the oil patch are weighing down industries peripheral to petroleum extraction as well, particularly the manufacturing and construction sectors. He noted that there are still three pockets of strength in the Province, agriculture, forestry and tourism. Most banks are estimating Alberta's GDP to contract about 0.5% in 2016 and are suggesting we will have \$50 oil by the end of the year.
- 2016 WCB Rates are going up, with the base rate for municipalities at \$1.19 plus any applicable surcharges.
- The STEP program is back and expected to provide temporary employment to approximately 3,000 students. Only full time positions are eligible (minimum of 30 hours . Week) for a minimum of 4 weeks to a maximum of 16 weeks in duration. The program provides a wage subsidy of \$7.00/hour for a maximum of 37.5 hours/week. The wage paid must meet the minimum wage which is currently at \$11.20/hour.
- Ross was able to make contact with CN relative to the potential purchase of the CN owned spur line that runs from Munson to just north of Morrin. A portion of the right-of-way would provide a significant expansion opportunity for our public works yard.
- Central Zone AHS EMS is coordinating test calls for the Emergency 911 system. They are looking for some volunteers for further test calls.
- Prairie Land Regional School Division provided a report which included current student counts. Delia School (K-12) shows 119 students, the Morrin School has 133.5 students and our colonies include, Blue Sky (17.5), Clover Leaf (26), Craigmyle (14), Neu

- Muehl (22.5), Starland (6) and Verdant Valley (26.5).
Year end work is now being completed in preparation for our Annual Audit scheduled for April 4th to 8th, 2016.
- A number of applications for the Heavy Duty Mechanic position were received and Ross will be working with AI to prepare a short list and set up interviews.

PW Report

At 10:00 a.m., Public Works Supervisor Pratt attended the meeting and reviewed his Public Works Report with Council. Highlights of his report included the following:

- Crews have been busy plowing and sanding roads, cutting trees, inventory counting, boarding up the windows in the Michichi Hall and they put up a bridge restriction signs on the Tiessen Bridge.
- Grader Operators have been plowing roads as needed, brushing and working on fence lines with the 6-way dozer.
- Mechanics are working on regular maintenance issues as well as some minor repairs.
- Tom has been doing annual CVIP inspections on trailers mostly and some minor repairs on some of the county units.
- Tom will be retiring as of Friday, January 29th, 2016.
- Brenda has been dealing with dog and cattle complaints, a road use agreement with Husky and dealing with a couple of service rigs.
- AI met with the graderman and a ratepayer with regards to the condition of the roads from the Budweiser Commercial Crew.
- He has been working with the graderman training program with EKpass.
- AI has been looking into costs for asbestos removal at the Michichi Hall.
- Also he has some quotes on spraying foam insulation into the sand quonset in the County compound.
- County crews will be moving the shop trailers to the Delia School on January 27, 2016.

Grader Operator
Training Proposal

CAO Rawlusk and Public Works Supervisor Pratt reviewed a proposal received from EKpass for grader operator training. This training is for approximately 6 persons and will focus on skill improvement in the area of road maintenance. Some of the topics that will be covered in the framework of the training will be cutting, sloping, pulling up ditches and crowning, shoulder pulling and gravel distribution. EKpass will provide onsite training and supply all training materials required for the price quoted. Training will be for 8 hours per day for one week. The quote for this training is \$11,950.00. Public Works Supervisor Pratt noted that he tentatively has six employees that he would like to enroll in this training program, including Ron Trout, Bill Finkbiner, Joe Lowther, Milton Wong, Colby Black and Dennis Schoonderbeek.

Wetlands Policy

CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

CAO Rawlusk reviewed the new Wetlands Policy which will affect all road construction projects within the County. In cases where avoidance or minimization of the wetland impacts cannot be achieved, restoration of drained wetlands is a compensation option. The replacement ratio is 3:1 and the cost of restoring these wetlands in the Horizon initiative is \$18,523.00 per hectare. For the Ewing Construction Project, 0.82 hectares of wetland habitat will be lost, so using the replacement ratio and value, this equates to \$45,566.58 plus GST as total compensation. For the Rowley Road 1.11 hectares of wetland habitat was lost, equating to \$61,681.59 plus GST as

total compensation. These Wetland Loss Compensation proposals must be accepted and paid to Ducks Unlimited Canada.

CAO Rawlusk reviewed the Asbestos Abatement Quote for the Michichi Community Hall. Ross Environmental Inc. provided a quote of \$19,984.00 plus GST, which includes the supply of men, equipment and materials to remove asbestos as per the Hazardous Building Material Survey Report. Hazardous waste will be hauled to the Drumheller Landfill.

Municipal Services
Report

At 11:00 a.m., Manager Riep attended the meeting and reviewed his Municipal Services Report with Council. Highlights of his report included the following:

- Crews have been busy flushing on several rural sections of line. The Morrin East line had to be flushed to bring the chlorination levels up to acceptable concentrations.
- Extensive flushing was also required on the Munson supply line that was recommissioned back into service since the new line was installed.
- Nu-Edge was called back to repair a water leak on the Reding water service connection. Proper installation practices were not followed.
- A significant amount of work is required to the Craigmyle Water System Fire Pump and Glen will be outsourcing this repair work.
- Morning Glory Water Co-op is trying to get their members to make necessary alterations including the installation of a meter vault and meter assembly as part of a system upgrade. These alterations are necessary to make the system more compliant and possibly in a position where the County may be able to operate the system for them.
- The Rumsey Fire Truck is complete and ready for delivery. The training and equipment demonstration is scheduled for next week at the Rocky Mountain Phoenix shop in Red Deer.
- Rocky Mountain Phoenix will also be appraising the used pumper trucks from Rumsey, Morrin and Craigmyle and Glen noted that we will most likely be looking at dispersing of one or two units, with Craigmyle getting one of the newer units.
- The Morrin Pumper unit is proceeding along with significant progress on the fabrication already completed. The preliminary inspection of the unit could be as early as March.
- Glen noted that he has issued several fire permits over the past month, including five applications which the new Brush Pile Burning Policy was implemented.
- The annual equipment testing was completed for all the fire departments breathing apparatus. Some minor repairs are required as well as some required hydrostatic testing of the bottles. The replacement of this equipment is another large capital item that will need to be considered.
- Glen is scheduling some Fire Meetings for February and March. February 9th - Hazmat Response Information session. March 10th will be the Annual fire Protection Committee Meeting to be held at the County Office, commencing at 7:00 p.m.
- The solar trailer unit that was being fabricated by Eguana was stolen from their compound in Calgary and found near Bragg

Creek. It has now been recovered and is presently in the Pronghorn shop in Drumheller to repair damages to some of the wiring and support structure for the generator housed in the unit. MPE Engineering and Pronghorn Electric have been commissioned to work on getting the generator/solar unit working and also the electrical work needed at the CLV Truckfill Station completed in order to facilitate the solar power generation portion of the project to be commissioned for service.

Morrin Fire Truck

Council reviewed the specification diagram for the Morrin Fire Truck being fabricated by Fort Garry Fire Trucks. This unit should be ready for a preliminary inspection as early as March.

AB Emergency Management Agency (AEMA) Workshop

The Alberta Emergency Management Agency (AEMA) is holding seven regional workshops around Alberta in February and March 2016. Councillor Sargent noted that he would be able to attend the workshop in Red Deer on February 11th, 2016.

Power Pole Replacement

CAO Rawlusk reviewed a proposal for pole replacement in the Hamlet of Craigmyle, prepared by ATCO Electric. Council discussed this proposal and the possibility of implementing solar as an alternative wherever possible.


