CAO Report

Chief Administrative Officer Ross Rawluyk reviewed his CAO Report with Council. Highlights of his report included the following:

- Ross noted that much of the past month has been devoted to compiling the final version of the 2016 Budget. He noted that the total assessment for the oil and gas industry decreased substantially and staff worked hard to trim the budget enough to maintain our taxation rates from last year. However, there are some increases on mill rates that are not in the County's control such as school taxation and the Senior's Foundation.
- In regards to the Farm and Ranch workplace Legislation, six working groups have now been established to develop recommendations on how employment standards, occupational health and safety and labour relations requirements should be applied.
- Kneehill County's Administration Office Grand Opening is on July 8th, 2016 with the ribbon cutting at 2:00 p.m.
- Ross, Matthew and Shirley recently attended the 15th Annual Municipal Administration Leadership Workshop (MALW) in Kananaskis from May 17th to 20th.
- Ross will be attending the Rural Employers of Community Peace Officers Meeting in Red Deer on Friday, May 28th, 2016.



- The Annual Toxic Waste Roundup is scheduled for Friday, June 3rd, 2016 at the Village of Delia Public Works yard, running from 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.
- Starland's ASB program has been chosen for an audit this year on August 3rd, 2016. This will be done in conjunction with an ASB Board Meeting, as the review team likes to meet with the Board and tour projects in the County that are supported by the ASB grant.
- The Mayor of the Village of Delia requested a meeting with Ross on Thursday evening. They are currently looking for a part-time CAO and have a Municipal Affairs review scheduled for early June.
- Ross was appointed by ARMAA to act as a panellist to review the Alberta Municipal Affairs awards for 2016.
- Ross is presently working on the transfer of the last tax recovery property from the Province. He met with Enerplus yesterday to update the license of occupation to a conventional lease agreement for the County. When completed, the County will have 9 quarter sections for eventual dispersal.
- A tourism advertisement was submitted for inclusion in the East Central Alberta Review Tourism Guide. Ross noted that we do need to update our photo file of images within the County.

At 11:00 a.m., Public Works Supervisor Pratt attended the meeting and reviewed his Public Works Report with Council. Highlights of his report included the following:

- The Starland Recreational Area access and Michichi Dam access roads were graded and packed.
- Crews have been installing culverts, widening some approaches, installing signs, putting the sand back into the sand shed and organizing grader blades in the shed as well.
- One of the spare graders has been using Unit 602 and the mulcher, completing 12 miles as well as some back roads.
- A couple of the public works employees have been assisting the Records Management ladies with lifting and setting up the filing shelves.
- Road crew equipment was hauled out to the Ewing Road construction project.
- Crews are building a pad at the Rumsey dugout, so that the water truck can load water out.
- Colleena is getting organized with the contract gravel truckers and had hoped to start May 24th. However, due to the rain, they now plan to start May 30th.
- The new water truck has been ordered from Freightliner.
- Dust control has commenced in some areas.

2016 Annual
Operating &
Capital Budgets

CAO Rawluyk and Assistant CAO Bremer reviewed the highlights of the proposed 2016 Annual Municipal Operating and Capital Budgets for Starland County with Council. The major projects for the year 2016 were highlighted and noted that the total operating budget expenditures are estimated at \$15,015,473.00 and the total capital budget is \$3,192,146.00, with an overall budgeted surplus of \$3,477.00. CAO Rawluyk noted that the total assessment within the County decreased approximately 6%. The largest

decrease in assessment was from Non-Residential properties, specifically the oil and gas sector. He advised that we worked towards maintaining a stabilized municipal tax rate in the County, however, school rates increased for non-residential properties and the Drumheller and District Senior's Foundation tax rate also increased. The major items in the Capital Budget Estimates besides replacement of various vehicles and equipment, include funding for some preliminary design work for new fire halls as well as money for land capital purchases and a bridge file rehabilitation.

At 1:35 p.m., Manager Riep attended the meeting and reviewed his Municipal Services Report with Council. Highlights of his report included the following:

- Crews have been busy working on the irrigation system and landscaping at the river, planting trees, mowing in cemeteries, hamlets and recreation areas, daily water system monitoring and testing, bacteriological sampling and recreation equipment repairs and annual maintenance.
- Glen noted that although we still have a fire restriction and advisory in place for all fires, he will be lifting the restrictions and once again issuing permits.
- Glen attended the Disaster Forum in Banff for emergency managers and operations personnel.
- The Alberta Emergency Alert System Training hosted by Starland

County and scheduled for May 26th has been cancelled as a result of the Fort McMurray incident and the involvement of AEMA.

- He attended an information meeting of the Dickson Dam operations centre. The session was to go over the status of the dam operations. At this point they are predicting a typical seasonal flow during spring run-off.
- Glen noted that the Michichi and Starland Recreational Areas are closed due to the current status of the access roads into the grounds. He is presently seeking cost estimates from a couple of companies to do road repairs at these sites.
