## CAO Report

Chief Administrative Officer Ross Rawlusk reviewed the CAO Report with Council. Highlights of his report included the following:

- Endeavor Accounting was in the office for a few days in early December to do the annual interim audit. Nothing unusual was noted however the environmental assessment being done on the CN property in Morrin may result in an environmental liability;
- Jordan Webber has arranged for Starland County to participate in the Rewatt Power Green Revenue Demonstration Project. The project will provide revenue from selling the green attributes from Starland's solar power projects. The innovative project will finally attempt to solve the problem of smaller projects obtaining the revenue that larger renewable energy projects obtain by selling their green attributes;
- This year we have two properties scheduled for tax sale in February;
- The Morrin Bridge received project approval from the Federal Government related to the Fisheries and Species At Risk Acts;
- The Village of Delia was recently approved for funding from the Federal Clean Water and Wastewater Fund. As the fund pays at 50% and we agreed earlier to fund 50% of Delia's portion Starland County will have to budget \$268,750 for the storage upgrade in 2017;
- We are working with Stantec on completing designs for our 2017 bridge program so that they will be available for STIP funding early in 2017;

- Ross has been working on a committee to modify the requisition formula for Palliser Regional Municipal Services. Our 2017 requisition came in at \$37,578.67, a 2% rise over last year.

Highlights

A summary of the highlights from the 2016 Fall AAMDC Convention was reviewed with Council. Topics of interest included the return of the STIP Program as well as the introduction of the Provincial Carbon Tax.

Morning Glory  
Operational  
Agreement

A legal opinion and draft agreement was received from Brownlee LLP outlining the options and potential issues surrounding a proposed operational agreement between Starland County and the Morning Glory Water Association. The opinion contained serious concerns regarding Starland County's possible designation as a "person responsible" with regards to the operation of the Morning Glory Water System. Under the proposed operational agreement Starland County could become liable for costly system upgrades as well as potential damages related to operating an unregistered system. Council was advised that a letter would be sent to the Morning Glory Association declining to participate in an operational services agreement for the reasons outlined in the legal opinion.

Council reviewed a briefing note submitted by the AAMDC regarding November House Amendments to Bill 21 the Modernized Municipal Government Act. Major changes in the amendments include a maximum of one Council Member on appeal boards as well as changes to the application of off-site levies.

Emerging Issues

A Continuing the Conversation document was received from the Government of Alberta outlining options around emerging issues that were excluded from the Modernized Municipal Government Act. Topics include aboriginal relations, governance and assessment. There is a possibility that some of these issues may be addressed in separate legislation in the spring of 2017.

Salary Survey

Ross reviewed with Council a copy of the AUMA/AAMDC Salary survey for 2016. Generally he noted that Starland County employees are at or just above the median salary for most comparable positions.

Land Purchase  
Options

Council was presented with draft offers to purchase two separate pieces of land: Lots 21 and 22; Block 4; Plan 5120 A.M. in the Hamlet of Rumsey and Lot 11; Block 7; Plan 2066 F.N. of the Village of Morrin.

Ross Advised council that the Rumsey parcel, which lies adjacent to the Rumsey water treatment plant, is currently for sale and would provide land for a future possible expansion of the Rumsey water treatment plant.



Including taxes owing the offer totalled \$42,829.70 for both lots. The lot in Morrin lies adjacent to the Starland County public works shop and as such has created land use conflicts. Additionally because the lot lies within the Village of Morrin, Starland County would require the consent of the Village to proceed with the purchase. The offer for this lot is \$32,990.00.

Morrin CN Land  
Development

Special Projects Manager Kreke updated council on the development plans for the recently acquired CN land running along the eastern edge of the Village of Morrin. He advised that future development of the land, including development of a new public works shop and yard, would require a number of studies to determine the condition of the land, the suitability and availability of Village infrastructure for servicing the land, and options for servicing and developing the land. For this purpose MPE Engineering has submitted two scopes of work encompassing Level 1 & 2 Environmental Assessments of the parcel, an infrastructure management plan for the Village of Morrin, and a site servicing and concept plan for the land lying within the Village of Morrin. It is also anticipated that these documents will become foundational documents for an Intermunicipal Development Plan and an Intermunicipal Collaboration Framework which will be required as per the recently introduced Modernized Municipal Government Act. Additionally as municipalities are encouraged to apply for Alberta Community Partnership grants to fund these types of studies an application on behalf of Starland County and the Village of Morrin will be made.

- He attended the Rural Utility & Safety Association Conference noting that there were interesting presentations on research concerning water contaminations. Glen currently sits on the Board of Directors and is involved in organizing the conference;
- His crew has been busy removing and relocating much of the recreation facilities located at the Morrin Bridge;
- The design plans are completed by MPE for the Rumsey water plant upgrades;
- The last fire training courses were held on November 26<sup>th</sup> and 27<sup>th</sup> and this concludes the grant funding received to run these programs;
- Goose Creek has been removed from the CLV water project due to repeated delays and failure to complete work. A full accounting of services paid for will be undertaken in the future.
- A package on some property for sale in Michichi was presented to council. He noted this land could be purchased with the intent of demolishing the buildings in an effort to clean up the Hamlet of derelict properties.
