



FENCING TENDER SPECIFICATIONS

Description:

Fencing shall consist of erecting wire fence, gates and related appurtenances of a County Policy fence (4 barbed wires with wooden posts at 16 foot spacings), in accordance with these specifications, and in conformance with the dimensions, details and requirements shown on the plans or as directed by the Road Foreman or Public Works Supervisor of Starland County.

Materials:

Materials for new fencing, including posts, wire, staples, prefabricated gates when specified, and all other miscellaneous materials will be supplied by the municipality. The materials will be supplied to the Contractor on the site of the job. Alternately, the Contractor can make arrangements to pick up the necessary materials at Starland County public works yard in Morrin, Alberta.

Receipt of Materials:

The Contractor shall be the receiver, and it shall be his responsibility to inventory the material received in each shipment delivered. A copy of the bill of lading shall be provided to the Contractor at the site, and shall be considered as proof of delivery and acceptance by the receiver of the materials. The Contractor shall be responsible for loss or damage to all materials which have been received and accepted in good condition.

Construction Requirements:

The fencing shall be constructed in accordance with the instructions provided by the Road Foreman or Public Works Supervisor of Starland County. The whole work of fencing shall be carried out in a substantial and workmanlike manner, and must be provided within 48 hours of the request by the county.

Where specified, existing fences shall be taken down, the materials carefully salvaged, wire must be rolled and the posts piled for pick-up by municipal forces. The municipality will supply new fencing materials and all fences will be constructed with new materials unless otherwise directed by the Road Foreman or Public Works Supervisor.

Payment Terms:

The construction of fences of all classifications and the taking down and re-erecting of existing fences will be measured by the mile, or fraction thereof, complete in place, including the length across constructed, installed or re-erected gates. Where fences are removed only, the existing fence will be measured by the Contractor, and payment will be made on the measure of distance as previously outlined.

Additional Requirements:

Starland County requires all Contractors to maintain a minimum of \$2,000,000.00 in liability insurance and will require an insurance certificate as proof of coverage.

Worker's Compensation coverage is also required and a WCB clearance letter must be supplied where applicable.

In addition, contractors and sub-contractors are also held responsible to follow Starland County's Health and Safety Program and meet all Occupational Health and Safety Legislation. They must follow procedures established by Starland County to protect the health and safety of everyone at the workplace. Prior to commencing work the contractor and all contracted workers must attend a health and safety orientation with Starland County's Health & Safety Officer. Personal protective equipment (PPE) is required to be worn and the contractor is responsible to supply their workers with this equipment. Starland County reserves the right to cancel any contracts if the contractor or sub-contractor are operating in an unsafe manner.
