CAO Report

Chief Administrative Officer Ross Rawlusyk reviewed his CAO Report with Council. Highlights of his report included the following:

- The Federation of Canadian Municipalities Conference was held in Edmonton from June 5th to 8th. Overall, the conference presentations were good as well as the workshop sessions.
- On June 18th, Reeve Hoover, Shirley and Ross attended the County of Stettler's 60th Anniversary celebration. Reeve Hoover presented the County with a clock that included a plaque that congratulated the County on their Anniversary.
- Farmer's Gravel Days will be held on July 6th at the Scollard Pit and July 7th & 8th at the Moench Pit.
- A joint meeting between Starland County and our three Village jurisdictions will take place on Monday, June 29th at the Morrin Community Hall.
- The Federal Government recently completed an overview of the Canadian Agricultural and Agri-food system. The report provides a snapshot of the Agriculture and Food industries. Canada is the world's fifth largest exporter of agriculture and agri-food products. Export sales grew by 5.5% in 2014 to \$46 billion. 50.8% of agricultural exports goes to the United States. Canada is the world's 6th largest importer bringing in \$34.3 billion of agriculture and agri-food imports, with 61.4% coming from the U.S.A.
- Starland County combined Assessment / Tax Notices are now printed and ready to be mailed out this week. Property assessments can be appealed anytime within the first 60 days after the notices have been mailed.
- The NDP Government has approved a \$2 million investment in energy efficiency and conservation initiatives led by local governments. The funding was provided to the Municipal Climate Change Action Centre (MCCAC). Ross is gathering information on evaluating all our buildings for retrofits and suggested that the

County should review when funding becomes available.

- Matthew and Jordan are working on some possible land developments costs for our new public works shop as well as some other initiatives.
- Jordan has completed an application for the Minister's Awards for Municipal Excellence. We are applying for our solar development project.
- Ross reviewed some of the details on the Highway Maintenance Budget for 2015/16 which were recently released. The summer maintenance budget has been reduced by \$27.8 million or 30% and is expected to stay at the reduced levels for the next 3 years. There will be no crack filling, no corrective / preventative projects, a 50% cut in water infrastructure funding, only one shoulder cut/year and no surface seals as well as many other cuts.
- Congratulations to Jessica Hayes who was the June winner of our newly implemented Near Miss Reporting award. She will receive a gift certificate from the Safety Committee.

At 10:00 a.m., Charity Vollman, East Central Program Coordinator from Junior Achievement and Diana Rowe, FCSS Coordinator, attended the meeting. Charity outlined the Starland County support programs which were presented in the Morrin School. She noted that Junior Achievement piloted 3 renewed programs and one new program. All programs utilize technology enhancements, with more hands-on engaging group activities and content that is current with our changing economy. Delia School was unable to participate in this program last year, but hope to be included this year again. Charity noted that they are once again requesting funding support from the County in the amount of \$4,000 for the 2015-2016 school year. This would support 6 educational programs for young people in Grades 5 to 12 as well as a \$1,000 contribution to the World of Choices as a Welcome Partner. At 10:30 a.m., Charity and Diana departed from the meeting.

At 11:00 a.m., Public Works Supervisor Pratt attended the meeting and reviewed his Public Works Report with Council. Highlights of his report included the following:

- Crews have been busy in the Hamlet of Craigmyle doing Hamlet Clean-up for two days, as well as demolishing six buildings and hauling the rubble to a burn pit, landscaping and general clean-up.
- Crews have also been cutting and trimming trees, hauling material including gravel, shale, top soil, installing address signs and cleaning up trees in ditches, etc.
- Additional crews have been assisting with spraying of MG30 flagging, moving signs, etc.
- Buck has been busy doing the regular services and repairs on the light duty fleet. He also finished welding screens on Unit #80, as well as cut up steel from Craigmyle and County yard.
- Tom has been doing CVIP's on the heavy duty fleet as well as minor repairs such as wiring, air leaks, etc.
- Thomas, Kevin and Tom had a Scan Tool Course in the County yard with a representative from Finning. Thomas and Kevin have

been doing repairs on various equipment as well as oil changes and other repairs, etc. Thomas also revamped the sod mulcher.

- 48 miles of the gravel program are now complete, as well as 10 miles of add-ons.
- Brenda has been busy with bylaw enforcement work and monitoring gravel hauls.
- Al met with Gord Wilton of Alberta Transportation with regards to SH849. Al showed him what parts of the light oil road the County would like to leave for dust control, with the County taking responsibility of maintaining these portions.
- Several dust control sites have been completed for ratepayers as well as some intersections.

Four submissions were received for the contract gravel hauler position advertised by the County. Council reviewed these submissions at length, giving consideration to the merits of each application.

At 1:45 p.m., Manager Riep attended the meeting and reviewed his Municipal Services Report with Council. Highlights of his report included the following:

- The truck fill stations have been very busy due to the heavy consumption for agricultural use. Glen has been working on the upgrade to the Rowley Water Station for the purpose of changing up the coin dispenser unit. If all goes well, the new unit should be installed in July.
- He attended an annual meeting of the Drumheller water users group to discuss any operational or water quality issues within the regional system. Drumheller, Starland and Kneehill are the main stakeholders and AENV and Alberta Health also participate in this annual review process.
- A considerable amount of time has been spent in the Craigmyle part working on the landscaping of the grounds including irrigation, trees, benches, pathways, topsoil/levelling, signs and

grass.

- The roadway within the Craigmyle Cemetery has been built and gravelled. The shale topping will be done when the majority of the tree planting and grass seeding operations are completed. The new gates will be installed sometime in the next few weeks.
- A S400 Fire Course was hosted in Drumheller earlier this month. He hopes to schedule a Pumper "A" course later this fall.
- The fire status has improved considerably over the past week or so and many fire permits have been issued. Permits are still being restricted to burn pits or cleared areas.
- He attended a meeting with the Morrin Fire Department to discuss the delivery of their new truck and also other fire matters. They are looking to purchase a thermal imaging camera. The camera will determine any hot spots, record the data and can be used in insurance or legal claims if necessary. The Fire Department have asked for any financial support from the County. They noted that it can be used throughout Starland County as well.
- Glen's crews have been very busy with the regular maintenance of the recreation areas and cemeteries, the ball diamonds repairs and work, as well as the extensive work being done in Craigmyle.

Comments must be submitted before August 31st, 2015 to the NRCB.

Information on the New Wetland Application Process

The AAMDC forwarded a Member Bulletin with regards to *Information on the New Wetland Application Process*. In accordance with the Alberta Wetland Policy, as of June 1, 2015, planned activities or water diversion in the White Area that may impact a wetland will require proponents to submit Water Act and Public Lands Act applications pertaining to wetland impacts.

Interim Qualified Wetland Science Practitioner Program

In addition, the AAMDC forwarded a Member Bulletin with regards to the Interim Qualified Wetland Science Practitioner Program. This program and standards will provide information to assist applicants in completing all stages of the wetland application process.

Amateur Team Grant Policy Review

CAO Rawlusk reviewed Policy No. 720-31, the Amateur Team Grant Policy, in response to the three applications received requesting Amateur Team Grant funding. The first request was received from the Rumsey and District Agricultural Society, requesting funding for the 27 participants in the Rumsey Minor Ball. The second request was received from Extreme Sports Camps whom are running local summer sports camps for elementary multisport camps as well as volleyball specific camps for both junior and senior high athletes. The third application was received from the Delia Summer Curling Camp, requesting funding for their curling camp. Council discussed the criteria required for funding under the amateur team grant policy and suggested that the Extreme Sports Camps and the Delia Summer Curling Camp be requested to send in a list of names of participants, prior to approval of their funding requests.
