CAO Report

Chief Administrative Officer Shirley Bremer reviewed the CAO Report with Council. Highlights of the report included the following:

- CAO Bremer has been working with a communications writer to develop a Starland County Spring Newsletter. Several managers have submitted information to the writer, and she will be interviewing other department managers to gather information. A draft document should be ready early next month. The quote for this project was \$1,950 and included research, interviews, article writing, proofreading, graphic design, and preparation of final copy. Once it is finalized, we will be printing the newsletter here and bulk mailing it to our residents. It will also be posted on the County's website.
- CAO Bremer has been working on the items noted in Starland County's 2020 MAP review. Several bylaws have been prepared for

today's meeting that should now comply with legislative requirements. Once all the bylaws and policies noted in the MAP review have been replaced or revised, they will be organized on our website in a format that will make it easier for the public to find. Two other bylaws that are in the process of being updated and amended are the *Master Rates Bylaw* and the *Aggregate Bylaw*.

- The County was served with a Statement of Claim on May 20, 2021. The County's involvement in this matter is limited to the issue happening on the County's street and has been forwarded to our insurance company who will appoint their own lawyer to the case.
- Blu Earth Renewables have completed an application to the County for Non-Residential and Machinery & Equipment Tax Incentives, pursuant to the Tax Incentives Bylaw No. 1151. Gordon Verok will be invited to the next meeting of the Starland County Council to provide more clarity to their application.
- Chuck Stern from Alberta Transportation advised CAO Bremer that the government was considering cutting the funding for the Bleriot Ferry. After further discussion, he called back to inform that they would be operating as per usual for the 2021 season. CAO Bremer asked that he advise Starland County should there be further discussions of closure as this is an important crossing to maintain for both our residents and for the tourist traffic.
- A meeting has been planned for May 27, 2021 with the Village of Morrin, the Morrin Sod House Reps and the County to discuss the proposed campground in Morrin.
- County photos are still scheduled for June 23, 2021 covid restrictions permitting. If the photo session is a go, we will plan a small retirement function for Alan Hampton on the same day.

PW Supervisors Report

Ken Menage, Public Works Supervisor, attended the meeting at 9:30 a.m. and reviewed his report with Council. Highlights of his report included:

- Public Works Crew has been busy flagging and repairing roads and potholes, crack filling roads in preparation for line painting, re-gravelling roads in eastern part of County, and started road construction on the Walker Road.
- Mechanics have been repairing equipment and completing CVIPs.
- Grader men have been blading roads and working to improve road conditions after rainfall.
- The following equipment has been purchased for the gravel program: 2016 Peterbilt, 2018 Kenworth, 2 belly dump trailers. Two side-dump trailers will be purchased later this year.
- Ken reviewed the seasonal hires for the 2021 season for the gravel crew, road crew and public works crew.
- Ken reviewed the scheduled 2021 projects as follows: Walker Road construction 40 days May and June; Grenville bridge construction 25 days July; Shand Bridge construction 25 days August; Morton Pit Archaeology study to be completed in June and haul road improvements/stripping September and October.
- Ken has been working on dust control program, 10-year road plan, 10-year bridge plan, and road use agreements.

Manager of Municipal Services Report

Glen Riep, Manager of Municipal Services, attended the meeting at 10:35 a.m. and reviewed his report with Council. Highlights of his report included:

- The recreation crew has been busy the last few weeks getting the campgrounds ready for opening on the May long weekend as well as pruning trees at the cemeteries.
- The expansion of the seasonal sites at the Michichi Recreation Area has been completed. There are now ten lots with all services for which nine have been taken and paid for on a seasonal basis.
- The online registration system for the McLaren Dam campground was officially launched May 3, 2021 and the registrations for the May long weekend went smoothly with all 18 serviced lots being booked

in advance.

- Site identification, numbering and mapping has started at the Starland Recreation area with 25 sites currently marked and labelled. This endeavour will be expanded to identify and number additional sites within the campground with a view to move to online booking in the future. There will also be group camping areas identified, like Tolman Bridge, and there will be a minimum fee of 5 camp sites for each of these areas.
- Starland County has taken over the operation of the East and West Tolman Bridge campgrounds. Remi Defoor has been hired as the seasonal campground attendant this year for these sites.
- We are still waiting for the final design on the CLV waterline replacement from MPE. Once received, it will be sent out for tender.
- The Michichi solar project has been delayed to next fall due to the sale of the project to another company. The Fox Coulee solar project is still ongoing, but a construction start date has not been identified.
- The entrepreneur partnership with Community Futures for establishing a vending outlet at the Horsethief Canyon is ongoing. A C-can has been purchased and is currently undergoing modifications so it can be used as an ice cream shop.
- The fire advisory for Starland County has been lifted effective May 26, 2021. Only burning in a pit with adequate fire guards in place will be allowed.

Big Country Gas Co-op – Use of Abandoned Road Allowance

Big Country Gas Co-op is seeking permission to run a gas line out of Rumsey, but surrounding landowners will not permit them on their properties. They are asking the County for permission to use the abandoned road allowance at NW24-33-21-W4 to further their infrastructure.

Starland County Fire Master Plan

Glen advised Council that he will be meeting with the Village of Delia to discuss the Fire Master Plan and Mutual Aid agreement between the Village and Starland County. No other municipality has responded to his letter regarding the Fire Master Plan. Glen will send another letter to all other participating municipalities asking for their input or agreement to enter into a Regional Fire Master Plan/Agreement.

Affairs Update

Starland County received confirmation from Alberta Municipal Affairs that the 2021 MSI capital allocation will be \$1,607,355 which includes \$1,186,523 in MSI capital funding and \$420,832 in Basic Municipal Transportation funding. This amount includes an advance of the 2022 MSI capital funding to help relaunch Alberta's economy. The 2021 MSI operating allocation is \$111,814 which includes \$61,364 in Sustainable Investment funding.

Raptor Ridge RV Resort Development – Water Rates Glen Riep, Manager of Municipal Services, attended the meeting at 2:30 p.m. He advised that the commercial non-ratepayer water rate structure needs to be established as construction has already commenced on this development and the Commercial Water Supply Agreement with Raptor Ridge RV Resort needs to be finalized. He recommended that the volume rate be set at 0.75 gallons per minute for a total of \$205,200 and the monthly commercial rate for water be set at 20% above residential rates.
