CAO Report

Chief Administrative Officer Ross Rawlusyk reviewed his CAO Report with Council. Highlights of his report included the following:

- Much of the last month was devoted to finalizing the 2014 Budget. He noted that the loss of local bridge funding has created a big impact to the County's budget, with almost \$1 million directed to the repairs and maintenance, as well as replacement of various bridges. The capital budget is also substantial, nearing \$5 million in capital purchases. In regards to assessments, residential assessments continued to climb and Seniors and School tax rates also increased. Ross noted that we continue to try and maintain the taxation rates at a steady level, taking all other factors into consideration.
- On April 30th he had a joint meeting with the members of the Morning Glory Water Co-op. The Co-op has been operating since 1985, but was never licensed or registered by Alberta Environment. Because of this licensing issue, Alberta Environment has a permanent boil order issued on the water co-op. One of the items that is pertinent for this Co-op is that they have a qualified operator manage their system. Ross noted that if the County could operate the system for them and work to get

them operating efficiently, we could keep the service available for that part of the municipality.

- Friday, July 11th, 2014 has tentatively been set for the Annual Starland County Family Picnic.
- Ross, Shirley and Matthew attended the Annual Municipal Administration Leadership Workshop in Kananaskis from May 13th to 15th.
- On May 8th, Ross met with the Board and members of the Drumheller and District Rural Crime Watch Association. They are trying to replace the existing phone fan-out system that is currently located in Carbon. He noted that the County has looked into some new software for this purpose and feels that there are enough advantages to having the system, that the County could manage the Crime Watch fan-out for the Association.
- Starland County's Annual Toxic Waste Roundup is to be held on Friday, June 6th at the Village of Delia Public Works Yard.
- Al Pratt and Ross met with representatives from Olds College who are working with Continuing Education to offer a Heavy Equipment Operator course based out of Drumheller. They have asked the County to assist with the site for the practical equipment operations portion of the course and may use the gravel pit beside the Transportation Pit.
- Shirley and Ross assisted the Village of Delia with their budget preparation and taxation bylaw.
- The CLV water project still has some ongoing reclamation and clean up issues. All water users are now on the system and testing and environmental clearances have been obtained.
- The Starland Regional Water Authority met on May 22nd, 2014 and the Authority is doing very well. The Authority decided to keep the water rate at \$2.42/cubic metre despite an expected water increase from the Town of Drumheller.

- Several employees attended the Front-end Loader Training Course as well as the Genie (man lift) Training.
- The Safety BBQ was held on May 23rd and an OH&S speaker attended to make a presentation on the ticketable offence regulations.
- Colby Black completed the Bridge Inspection Course, receiving a very good examination result.
- Crews are completing regular maintenance items around the County.
- Gradersmen are busy blading the gravel roads and touching up the dirt roads as they go.
- Brenda is busy monitoring the farmers and shutting down county roads when they are too wet.
- The road crew is at the Airport Hill Project working on a driveway and roadways there. Some of the road crew are working on the Rowley Hill Road Project.
- Two days were spent working in the Village of Delia, preparing the pad for the Communities in Bloom Committee's project.
- The SADD sign was put up at the Morrin School.
- Al has also been busy with orientations, ordering products, meeting with clients with regards to various projects and working with Doug on the numerous projects to be completed this season.

Municipal Services
Report

At 2:25 p.m., Manager Riep attended the meeting and reviewed his Municipal Services Report with Council. Highlights of his report included the following:

- Some of his employees took the Genie Operator Training Course.
- Crews have been busy with tree planting at the Craigmyle Playground and the campgrounds, mowing at Craigmyle, Delia & Rumsey Cemeteries, and mowing in the hamlets.
- The final clean-up operations are being done on the CLV water system upgrade. Chinook is filling in the remaining excavation holes and around the meter pits in the private yards. Glen's crew assisted in the flushing of the lines by collecting bacteriological samples and having the lab testing done. All the samples have been returned as good and they are now doing the final commissioning of each service by doing some localized flushing of the meter vault and activation of the meter. Once this is completed, water service to those residents is ready for use.
- The Craigmyle Lift Station project has started with the contractor doing the site preparation work, including the road and building pad site. 3-phase power to the site and gas service are to be completed within the next month.
- Upgrades to the CLV Truck Fill Station have commenced with some of the electrical work being done. A new water dispensing unit has been installed at this station and is a coin-less operation, meaning all water payments are done by an account. A new user is required to call the office and have an account set up with a PIN number. At the end of each month we download the water use data from the unit. The program that comes with it will automatically calculate and create a water invoice for each user.
- He met with the Morning Glory Water Co-op to discuss their operations and look at ways to assist the Co-op in the daily water operations, working towards having the system eventually becoming compliant.
- Steve and Glen attended the Disaster Forum in Banff which had some interesting topics. Many of the presentations focussed on the flooding in southern Alberta last year and how those communities dealt with different issues presented during that type of an event. Glen is working with Bruce Mackenzie to organize a

refresher and ICS 200 class sometime this year.

- Starland's recreation areas were busy again this last long weekend. A 'closed gate' restriction was implemented to the Starland Recreation Area, whereby no vehicles were allowed into the property between 11 p.m. and 6 a.m. each day. This was to prevent the party group or problem makers from entering during that period. This seemed to have a positive result and Glen intends to do the same for all long weekends this year.
- Glen investigated a damage claim by a visitor of the Michichi Campground. The incident is alleged to have resulted from driving through a depression in the road which caused the bumper to have contact with the ground, causing damage to it. This investigation and report will be filed with our insurance provider.
- Glen has completed a couple of fire inspections and reports on some facilities in Delia. He assisted the Delia Ag Society in their 100 year celebration and use of the arena for some of the events. In addition, he also completed a building inspection for the renovated hotel in Delia which plans to re-open soon.

2014 Annual
Operating &
Capital Budgets

Special Projects Manager Kreke and Assistant CAO Bremer reviewed the highlights of the proposed 2014 Annual Municipal Operating and Capital Budgets for Starland County with Council. The major projects for the year 2014 were highlighted and noted that the total operating budget expenditures are estimated at \$13,423,650.00 and the total capital budget is \$4,912,950.00, with an overall budgeted surplus of \$5,502.00. CAO Rawlusk noted that the total assessment within the County increased approximately 3.44%. The largest increase in assessment was from Class 1 - Residential Properties, which increased 15.63%. Non-Residential properties also increased approximately 4.23%. As always, he advised that we work towards a stabilized total tax rate in the County. In 2014, the draft budget presented will see a substantial decrease in Class 1 Residential tax rates, to potentially stabilize their total tax bill. The School tax rates increased 2.17% for Residential and Farmland properties, and decreased 6.04% for Non-Residential properties. The Non-Collection Allowance increased 4.58% and the Drumheller and District Senior's Foundation tax rate increased 12.06%. The major items in the Capital Budget Estimates besides replacement of various vehicles and equipment, include the replacement of the Craigmyle Sewer Lift Station, four major bridge/culvert replacements, and the CLV Water Expansion and Upgrade Project.

With the replacement ratio of 3:1, 1.65 hectares of restored wetland habitat will be required. The cost of restoring these wetlands in the Horizon initiative is \$11,500.00/hectare, equating to \$18,975.00 plus GST as total compensation.

As well, the oil and gas companies affected were also notified that they need to arrange to enter into a replacement Private Surface Agreement, a Utility Right of Way Agreement or a Pipeline Agreement, as the case may be, within 60 days of the date of the notification letter, dated April 16, 2014.
