Attendance of Finance Auditor & Auditor's Report

At 9:30 a.m., Jeff Faupel, from Endeavor Chartered Accountants, attended the meeting to review Starland County's 2013 Audited Financial Statements with Council. He also presented the *Independent Auditor's Report* to members of Council. He noted, that the consolidated financial statements present fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of the Starland County as at December 31, 2013, the results of its operations, change in its net financial assets (debt) and its cash flows for the year in accordance with Canadian public sector accounting standards. Mr. Faupel reviewed the various consolidated statements of operations, deferred revenues, debt limits and equity in Tangible Capital Assets with Council, who are also the Audit Committee. In conclusion, Mr. Faupel advised Council that he had no recommendations to submit with his audit findings and that Starland County is in a good and stable financial position.

At 10:25 a.m., Public Works Supervisor Pratt attended the meeting and reviewed his Public Works Report with Council. Highlights of his report included the following:

- Crews have been busy steaming culverts and hydro-vaccing problem areas around the County.
- They have been assisting with cleaning some of the road equipment and removing snow equipment from some of the equipment.
- Red Deer Overhead Door fixed one of the overhead doors and serviced the other four doors.
- Brenda has been monitoring Atco Power and Four Winds. She is also taking a three day course for TDG Training in Drumheller.
- Buck has been doing regular maintenance on the light duty fleet as well as working on the legs of the solar panel structures in Delia and Morrin to re-enforce them.
- Tom is still busy completing CVIP's on County and Fire Department equipment.
- Thomas and Kevin have been doing regular maintenance on the heavy duty fleet as well as removing snow plow wings off of some of the graders.
- New windows were installed into the Terex TS14 due to the vandalism last fall.
- Some of the gradermen have been doing light blading in their divisions.
- Al met with Kyle Suntjens from Total Control Security Inc. with regards to surveillance equipment for the public works yard and other high risk areas.
- He has been interviewing people for summer employment.
- He has completed a Job Hazard Assessment for steaming and other tasks.

At 11:40 a.m., Public Works Supervisor Pratt departed from the meeting.

CAO Report

Chief Administrative Officer Ross Rawlusk reviewed his CAO Report with Council. Highlights of his report included the following:

- The 2013 audit process went very well, with no issues of substance to work through. Our unrestricted surplus increased by \$112,039.00 and we allocated \$550,000.00 to a capital general contingencies fund that is planned to go towards a new public works shop facility or fire hall construction. In addition, at the end of 2013 we have \$3,088,114.00 deferred grant and this is waiting for the new public works shop and Craigmyle Lift Station. Our overall cash position is up and Starland County continues to have no total debt or debt servicing.
- For the second year in a row, Starland County has been nominated for an Emerald Award. The awards will be announced at an award ceremony in Calgary on June 5th. We are doing some work on a short video that will highlight the County's efforts to display leadership in solar technology.
- Lacombe County is heading a committee to look at options for recycling agricultural waste plastics. They are hoping to get a number of municipalities together to develop a plan and apply for a collaboration grant to work towards a solution.
- BluEarth Renewables Inc. provided an update on their Handhills wind project. They are in a bit of a delay waiting for construction of the transmission infrastructure which is required to get the power generated into the grid. ATCO Electric has made an application to the Alberta Utilities Commission for the interconnection of the Hand Hills Wind projects, but a hearing on the project might be required.
- The Federal Government is carrying out an information campaign on the PCB regulation that came into effect in 2008.
- The e-guage power monitoring software has now been installed on several facilities in Starland County. This will allow us to aggregate how much power our solar power systems are generating and better analyse installation factors and climatic conditions.
- Ross and Shirley have completed all of the MSI Grant and Gas Tax Grant claims. In 2014, we will be getting \$1,100,545.00 in MSI Capital Funding which we are planning on allocating to fire hall construction. MSI Operating Funding in the amount of \$121,174.00 will be applied to our Recreation Grants to community halls and arenas in the County; and \$420,832.00 in the BMTG Component will be used for gravel purchase. Federal Gas Tax Funds will be dedicated for payment of the Craigmyle Lift Station.
- Alberta Municipal Affairs Minister Ken Hughes has resigned his post and Greg Weadick, previously the Associate Minister, has been appointed as the Acting Minister of Municipal Affairs.

The Federation of Canadian Municipalities forwarded information with regards to the New Building Canada Fund and how members can apply for funding for the three components of it; the National Infrastructure Component (NIC), the Provincial-Territorial Infrastructure Component (PTIC) and the Small Communities Fund (SCF). This new program was launched on March 28, 2014 and is a \$14 billion, 10 year plan to invest in provincial, territorial and municipal infrastructure.

Correspondence was received from Alberta Tourism, Parks and Recreation, announcing a new incentive to make it easier to install or replace tourism attraction highway signs. Effective immediately, tourism operators and communities no longer have to pay renewal fees for two types of attraction signs. Operators will still have to sign a permit agreement every five years to ensure highway signs are current for attractions open to the public.

CAO Rawlusyk discussed a request from the Delia Homecoming Committee, requesting 60 sign posts for their heritage signs. The prices are still being checked into, and the cheapest so far is approximately \$29.00 per post.
